New Mural Captures 77 Years of Credit Union History

Ladysmith & District Credit Union is excited to announce the completion of our Wall of History, a beautiful new work of art showcasing over 77 years of the Credit Union's history by renowned local artist Kathy Oliver. From our humble beginnings of a meeting at Nicholson's Hall, (above the Wigwam), to the \$300+ multi million entity of today, this beautiful mural encapsulates our history, and the history of our support for our community.

It starts with portraits of three of our founding members: our first President: Rev. Everett Fleming; the first female President of a Credit Union Board: Helmi Kotilla; and one of our longest serving directors: John Ulinder, who attended every AGM for 50 years. Another connection to our beginning is the inclusion of a locomotive from the Comox Logging Co., many of whose employees were founding members of the Credit Union.

Highlighting our growth, each of the previous Credit Union offices, from 1948 – 1974 are portrayed along with the Credit Union's past and current logos, including those for our subsidiaries: LCU Insurance Agencies, and LDCU Financial Management.

Major landmarks of our community that have been supported by the Credit Union are immortalized here including: the Ladysmith Amphitheatre, the Transfer Beach Spray Park, and the Ladysmith Skatepark, among so many others.

DIRECTOR NOMINATIONS

All candidates seeking election to the Board of Directors must complete and submit a nominations package to the Nominations Committee by the deadline of Feb. 18, 2022. Packages can be picked up at the Credit Union or downloaded from www.ldcu.ca.

Credit Union members who are eligible to stand for election to the Board of Directors must qualify pursuant to the Financial Institutions Act, and the Credit Union Incorporation Act. In addition, they must be a member in good standing for a period of 12 consecutive months, be a minimum of 19 years of age, and qualify subject to the Rules of LDCU.

In addition, each member in good standing of LDCU who is 19 years of age or older, is

entitled to sponsor the nomination of one candidate. According to our Credit Union Rules, a member in good standing is a member, who at the date on which good standing is determined:

- has purchased, paid for, and holds, the number of Membership Equity Shares required by the Rules;
- b) has been a member of the Credit Union for at least ninety (90) days;
- c) is not more than ninety (90) days delinquent in any obligation to the Credit Union; and
- d) has paid an annual membership fee as determined from time to time by the Directors, (if required).

Please note:

- Where each member in joint tenancy individually holds sufficient Membership Equity Shares to meet membership requirements, (\$5 per separate member), both may nominate a candidate.
- A member that is a legal entity and not an individual, (i.e. limited company, registered society, or other legal entity), may authorize in writing, one person, on its behalf, to exercise its right to nominate a candidate.

Also showing on the wall are a few of the one-time and annual events supported by the Credit Union including: Ladysmith Days, the Kids 'Count Fun Zone, Logger Sports, Festival of Lights Light-Up Night, Show 'N' Shine, and Chamber of Commerce events.

Interspersed throughout the mural are a myriad of sponsorships; the Arts of the Avenue, the LSS Lunch Program, the Ladysmith Storybook Walk, LAFF events, even another train: the Polar Express, proudly numbered 1944, the year of the Credit Union's inception. We are especially proud to showcase our support for Ladysmith Secondary Grads, with annual bursaries amounting to more than \$18,000. and for young ladies in our community through the Ladysmith Ambassador Program.



DID YOU KNOW...?

New to the Province? You have 90 days to obtain a BC Drivers' License. When you visit our office, please make sure you bring primary and secondary ID. Not sure you have the ID you need? Visit ICBC.com and choose "Confirm my Required ID" to save yourself an extra trip!

Distracted driving is the number one cause of accidents in BC. Not only is dangerous, it can put a serious dent in your wallet! When you are caught, you will be ticketed and receive a fine of \$368. This will add four driver penalty points to your driving record. Annually, if you have four or more points on your driving record, you'll pay an additional driver penalty point premium. These premiums start at \$252 and will increase for every point you accumulate. Two or more distracted driving tickets will earn a three year driver risk premium.

Feel like you've been waiting forever for your license or ID card to come in the mail? Check out icbc.com and use their online card status checker to find out if it's on its way, or still being processed.

You will need

- I Your card number. You can find this on your Interim Driver's Licence, your application for a BC ID card, or your BC Services Card Statement of Declaration.
- 2 Your ICBC keyword. Your keyword is one you have set with our staff during your visit to one of our offices.

Remember, the yellow interim you receive at renewal is only valid for 60 days so keep an eye on its expiry!
